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# **Authorship Criteria**

Authorship credit should be based only on substantial contributions to each of the three components mentioned below:

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Participation solely in the acquisition of funding or the collection of data does not justify authorship. General supervision of the research group is contributor should have participated sufficiently in the work to take public responsibility for appropriate portions of the content of the manuscript. be based on the relative contribution of the contributor towards the study and writing the manuscript. Once submitted the order cannot be change contributors. The journal prescribes a maximum number of authors for manuscripts depending upon the type of manuscript, its scope and number authors should provide a justification, if the number of authors exceeds these limits.

Editorials, correspondence, comr contributions need not carry abstracts.

### Conclusions

Keywords: Provide up to five keywords or short phrases that can be used for indexing, immediately following the abstract.

Use terms from Index Medicus Medical Subject Heading (MeSH).

**Guidelines On Style:** Headings in Text. Use a maximum of three levels of headings. Abbreviations should be sparingly used and only to save s regimes. In a figure or table, define the abbreviation in a foot-note. List in an alphabetical order all none standard abbreviations (with definitions) Drugs should be indicated by their generic names but not trade names except for drugs showing adverse reaction or those used in comparison of Tables should be submitted one each on separate sheets, typed double-spaced, and numbered and referred to in the text by Arabic numerals. To be indicated. A brief title describing the content in the table should be supplied at the top. Give each column of the table a short heading. Explan For footnotes, use the following symbols in the given sequence in order from left to right or from top to bottom in the body of the table etc. \*,†,‡,§ No internal horizontal or vertical rules should be used in the table. If a table must extend beyond a page, repeat the title followed by "cont" and really little followed by "cont" and really should be submitted in quadruplicate, and should be black and white glossy prints of very high quality. Illustrations should not be larger than an A4 (300 x 21 Letters, numbers and symbols should be even and clear throughout and of sufficient size that when reduced for publication each item will still be notes should be in the respective legend and not in the figures themselves.

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**Acknowledgements:** Acknowledgement of general support, financial and material support, technical, secretarial help etc. should be indicated at responsibility of the authors to obtain consent of those being acknowledged.
